

Disability Access

Policy

The college will attempt to provide education for students with disabilities on the same basis as a student without a disability. The provision of education will be determined by safety, justifiable hardship to the school, and the capacity of the student.

Procedure – Determining a Reasonable Adjustment

1. A reasonable adjustment is an aid, a facility, or a service that the student requires because of his or her disability.
2. The Principal will consult with the parent and/or guardian and the student as to the:
 - a. Nature of the disability
 - b. The opinion of the parent and/or guardian, the student, and any consultants engaged by the school as deemed appropriate by the Principal
 - c. The ability of the student to achieve learning outcomes
 - d. The ability of the student to participate in courses or programs
 - e. The independence of the student
 - f. The effect of the proposed adjustment on anyone else affected, including the college, staff and other students
 - g. The costs and benefits of making the adjustment
3. The Principal will determine whether to proceed with the reasonable adjustment or to determine that the education of the student with a disability would result in unjustifiable hardship.
